A man of many talents

Many artworks, at first glance, seem simple and straight forward until you study them closely and start to see many colors, shapes and nuances you did not first recognize. That same thing can sometimes be said of people.

BRAA member Kirk Carter is one of those folks.

Among the art association membership, Carter is mostly known as a photographer. He has held solo exhibitions in the local area, published three photo books, won a respectable number of awards and often teaches photography workshops for all skill levels.

He was one of the presenters in the 2015 photography forum organized by BRAA at the Moss Arts Center in Blacksburg.

The plein air artists in our group know him as a regular attendee under the skies with his watercolors.

Those who spend time with Carter soon come to know behind his warm and somewhat quiet demeanor is a man of humor and seemingly endless talents.

Carter was born in Presque Isle, Maine, where he stayed until he went to New York University at the age of 17 to get his bachelor of fine arts in film production. That was the first of many moves, which paved the way to Blacksburg in 1999.

One of his New York productions was a documentary about Rafael (Ray) Suarez, currently host of the international news and analysis public radio program, America Abroad. From New York he moved to New Hampshire to a local cable station and did documentaries, magazine shows and commercials.

Orlando, Fla., was his next stop at another cable station producing shows on subjects such as blue grass and golf. He received the Award for Cable

Excellence, National Academy of Cable Programming, 1991, for his television production of "Orlando Theatre Project: Rapunzel."

Carter decided engineers made more money than local cable TV producers and headed to the University of Central Florida (UCF), for a bachelor's degree in electrical engineering and became a certified engineer. "While at the university," said Carter, "I was on the Electric Knight team and built a dashboard system for our electric car conversion. We won: Best Overall and Best Endurance, Clean Air Grand Prix, Clean Air Vehicle Assn., 1994.

Additionally, at UCF he designed and built a circuit to stabilize an industrial laser.

From there Carter entered the cellular world as a radio frequency engineer with AT&T during the transition from analog to digital. He invented a new way to create base stations for AT&T and they took out a patent on it. Another project in Florida started him down the path to Blacksburg. "It was my new formula," commented Carter, "for radio wave propagation from leaky coax that prompted the paper for the Virginia Tech Mobile and Portable Radio Research Group's Symposium on Wireless and Personal Communications in 1998. I presented the paper to wireless researchers from everywhere."

That event was crucial in his path to Blacksburg. Next thing he knew he was offered a job with a Blacksburg company in 1999, took it and was asked to build the company a website.

Incredibly, Carter had not yet acquired that skill, so he taught himself. "Since 2000, I have been self employed as a web designer working out of my home," he said with a sort of "why not?" look on his face. Always open to learning new things, Carter is currently learning watercolor and inventing tabletop games.

He lives in Christiansburg with three cats and his wife, Terry Ellen, who is the office manager at the Habitat for Humanity Restore not far from their home. That home is a perfect reflection of his many skills.

Photography from his book and exhibition entitled "Underfoot Abstracts" graces several of the walls. A glass case holds three dimensional cartoon assemblages complete with the familiar word balloons. Cartoons? Yes. In 2011, Carter attended a workshop in Vermont at the Center for Cartoon Studies.

One room is reserved for creating art; another, filled with large computer monitors, is for all his web design.

Carter is a regular at BRAA luncheons and plein air events where he paints in watercolor. "When I found out about BRAA, I decided to give it a try," said Carter. "I went to my first monthly luncheon, listened to everyone tell about their art endeavors and immediately knew I had found MY people!"
